ABOUT DRASA

DRASA launched in October 2015 with the mission to keep society safe from public health threats through the advancement of infection control practices, hygiene and sanitation behaviors, and outbreak preparedness measures.

During our first year of operation, our goals were to:

- Launch a community health program
- Solidify strategic partnerships for our healthworker simulation training program
- Increase awareness and visibility of DRASA

During our first year, we raised **N106,848,393** in financial and in-kind donations, formed partnerships with **4 institutions**, and reached an estimated **9,554 students and teachers** in **13 communities** across Lagos state through our community handwashing and hygiene program.

OUR PROGRAM

The #ItStartsWithMe
Handwashing and Hygiene Program

8,975 primary and secondary school students and 579 staff and distributed 72,000 bars of soap, 900 bottles of liquid handwash, 6,000 tubes of lotion, and 12,000 roll on deodorants to promote clean hands, encourage good personal hygiene, and help prevent the spread of infectious diseases in 13 communities across Lagos state.

Over **100 volunteers** including celebrities, government officials, and young professionals across various industries and locations donated more than **500 hours** of their time to support our #ItStartsWithMe program.






ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS
