In Nigerian communities, low uptake of routine prevention practices, weak community-level disease detection, and poor sanitation cause preventable diseases to spread—**62%** of caregivers delay seeking treatment for a child's fever, and **48** million people still practice open defecation.

DRASA equips citizens as Health Champions to promote healthy behaviors, prevent illnesses, and quickly detect diseases

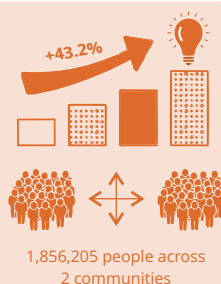
Improving Community Knowledge & Response on Infectious Diseases

2,089 community members trained (artisans, youth, market women, religious leaders)



30+ suspected disease cases detected (mpox, measles, and cholera.) within **3** months

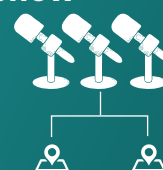
