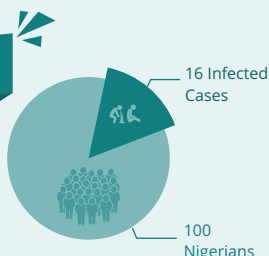

Status: Policy launched and nationwide dissemination in public & private facilities ongoing

Strengthened IPC capacity in **3** Local Government Areas (LGAs) & **7** PHCs



201 health workers trained



49.71% improvement in IPC knowledge

Implementing a Diploma in Infection Prevention and Control (DIPC)

Partner: University of Lagos, Centre for Infection Control and Patient Safety



12-month, competency-based program (Basic-Intermediate-Advanced)



5 cohorts, **386** certified professionals



Operating across Nigeria's **6** geopolitical zones



Graduates driving evidence-based IPC in hospitals & clinics

Executing the Turn-A-State Orange (TASO) Model

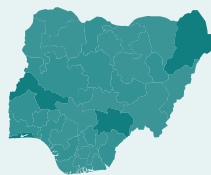
Partner: NCDC and State Ministries of Health in the 3 states



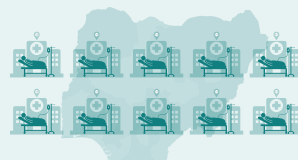
Goal: Support state health authorities and build & mentor a skilled health workforce for sustainable IPC systems



Approach: Innovative financing & real-time data for decisions



Approval received from NCDC to implement across **3** states, **1** LGA per state



Identification of **10** facilities for implementation (primary, secondary and private) commenced with the States and NCDC

Supported Nigeria's COVID-19 Pandemic Response



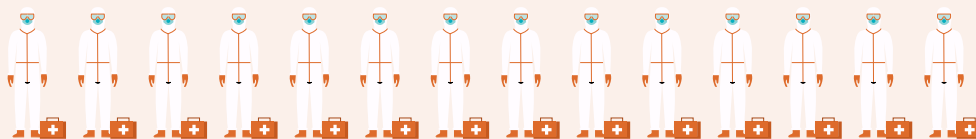
Scope: **6** states supported (including Lagos, the pandemic epicenter)



4,019 health workers trained on IPC and pandemic response



21 guidelines & SOPs developed



1,803
